Visningsrommet USF gallery opened in 1993 and has since then been a valued exhibition space for artists - run by artists, an advisory board, a curator and with support from USF. The gallery has been a busy place, with eight to ten annual exhibitions and a number of other art events. The space is flexible and suitable for media such as objects, screenings, sound and lights, as well as wall based fine art.



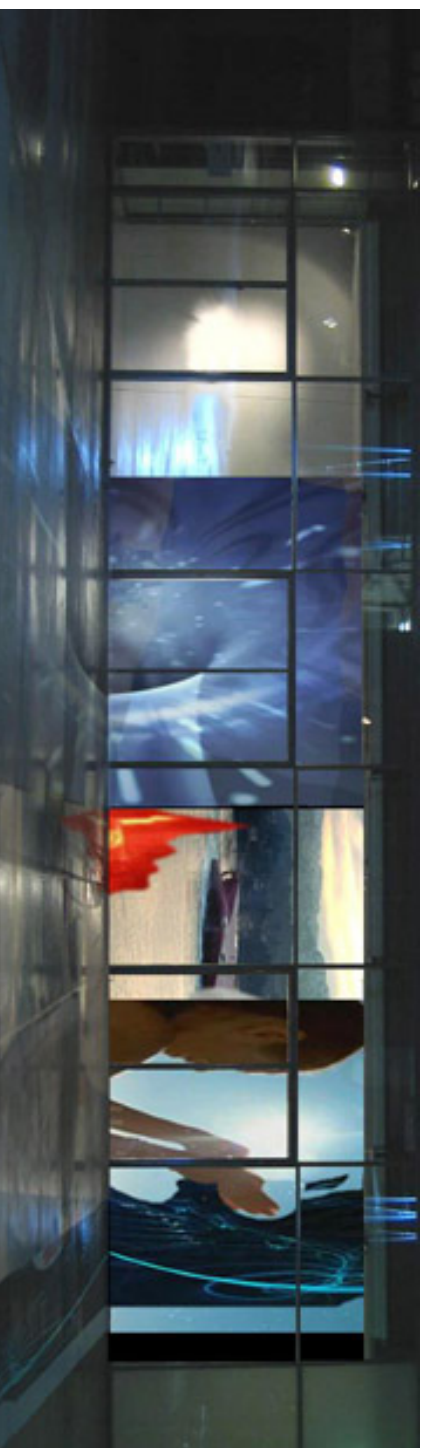
The gallery has a glass-fasade and the floor is levelled with the fair coloured concrete-floor of the outside open place. This connects the inside with the outside, makes a transparent feel and give possibilities to expand the exhibition area. In the opposite case, there are blindfolds to shut off the view in/out.



Exhibitions of large objects or installations based on projections and light will have striking visibility at night.

ADDITIONAL AREAS AT USF

The 92-seet cinematek at USF is located next to the gallery. It can screen most film and video-formats, from 16 mm to 30/70 mm to digital screenings. The cinematek offer also the best of sound equipment and a very committed staff.

The Sardinien area, just along the hall from the gallery and cinematek, is used for club-concerts, mainly jazz and contemporary. It is equipped with high quality sound and projection/lighting systems and is also used for seminars and smaller conventions. With the café and restaurant kitchen next door, it is easily transformed into a dinner club in the evening, seating up to 160 guests. Sardinien also has adjacent bars, lounge and outside areas overlooking the fjord.

The large concert hall at USF, at the moment under renovation and upgrading, re-opens jan / feb 2013 and will be available for larger conventions and dining, as well as music and art events. Total capacity will be 1200 standing / 450 seated.
